FORCE OPTIONS SIMULATOR TRAINING

COURSE OUTLINE

Course Goal: This course in intended to present officers with realistic incidents similar to which they encounter on a daily basis, where they are forced to make use decisions on whether or not to use force, and if so, what level of force based on the scenarios presented to them.
