Subject: ADMINISTRATIVE PER SE

### INTRODUCTION

The following policy defines the proper method for documenting the Administrative Per Se suspension and/or revocation of driving privileges, as a result of driving under the influence of alcohol independent of court action. This process authorizes a peace officer to seize any California license in the possession of the DUI offender (there is no statutory authority to seize out-of-state licenses, immediately serve the driver with order of suspension, and issue a temporary driver's license. This process shall take place when the offender's blood alcohol level is 0.08 % or more (CVC 13353.2), or when the offender refuses to submit to a chemical test, CVC 23612 (a) (1) (A).

## **PROCEDURE**

Members of the Barstow Police Department will administer the Administrative Per Se as follows:

- 1. Drivers arrested for DUI pursuant to CVC Sections 23140, 23152, and 23153 are subjected to Administrative Per Se regulations when one of the following circumstances occurs.
  - a. Driver refuses to submit or fails to complete the chemical test pursuant to Sections 13353 and 23612 of the Vehicle Code.
  - b. Driver submits to a breath test which shows a BAC of 0.08 % or greater for both breath samples.
  - c. Driver submits to a blood or (if the offense is drug related and/or the breath and blood tests are unavailable) urine test, and the officer believes that the BAC is 0.08 % or greater. If the test results later show a blood alcohol concentration of less than 0.08 % the suspension will be set aside.
  - d. Upon consenting to a breath test, the driver refuses a blood or urine test as required by the drug admonition contained on the DS367 or DS367M (under 21 years) form.

Note: if the subject is arrested for a DUI combination of alcohol and drugs, the arresting officer must have a reasonable belief that the BAC is above 0.08 %. Administrative Per Se provisions apply only to BAC levels and/or refusals, not for DUI of drugs. Therefore, if the subject is arrested solely of DUI of drugs, Admin Per Se is not involved.

- 2. The officer will note any license restrictions issued by DMV on the Order of Suspension.
- 3. Clerical personnel and the Evidence Technician will coordinate with the District Attorney and forensic laboratory to insure the chemical test results are obtained in a timely manner. Chemical test results shall be forwarded to the DMV within fifteen (15) calendar days.
- 4. When a person is taken into custody who is under the age of twenty-one, complete a DS 367M in lieu of the standard adult DS 367 form.
- 5. The arresting officer shall issue the pink copy of the DS 367 form in all cases, regardless of the driver's driving privilege status or whether or not they possess a California license. The temporary driver's license serves as the 30-day temporary driver license endorsement which clearly specifies the terms and conditions under which the license is valid.
- 6. The arresting officer shall confiscate the violator's California license and attach it to the DMV's copy of the Officer Statement.
- 7. Clerical personnel shall photocopy the DS 367, Officer's Statement, and retain the law enforcement copy (yellow) of the DS 367, Suspension/Revocation and Temporary Driver's License, and maintain these documents in file.
- 8. Clerical personnel shall insure that the original Officer's Statement, original Suspension/Revocation and Temporary Driver's License, the violator's California license (if available), and a copy of the breath test results are forwarded to DMV within five (5) business days. If the violator submitted to a blood or urine test, the chemical test results shall be forwarded to DMV using a Supplement to Officer's Statement Blood/Urine Test Results (DS 367A), or the Department of Justice/County Forensics Chemical Test Results Certification within fifteen (15) calendar days. REGARDLESS OF THE BLOOD/URINE CHEMICAL TEST RESULTS, ALL TEST RESULTS SHALL BE FORWARDED TO DMV.
