## HUB OF THE WEST



Barstow is nestled against the Calico Mountains and the Mojave River in Southern California's picturesque San Bernardino County and serves as a transportation gateway for points west to east.

Barstow is strategically located along two major interstates that connect California to Nevada, Arizona, and beyond, as well as seven airports within a 130 mile radius.

## HISTORICAL LANDMARKS

Barstow is home to many historic trade routes and landmarks, dating back to the 16th century. The Old Spanish Trail spanned 700 miles and six states, connecting Los Angeles to Santa Fe, New Mexico. Calico Ghost Town, a hallmark of California's Silver Rush, was established in 1881. In 1926, Route 66 became "The Mother Road" of the country, spanning over 2,400 miles and connecting the main streets of rural and urban communities across eight states.

- Barstow is a logistics hub for Burlington Northern and Santa Fe (BNSF) Railway, one of the largest freight railroads in North America.
- Barstow is home to the Marine Corps Logistics Base and is in proximity to the Fort Irwin National Training Center, two large drivers of economic activity.
